Meeting Focus:

Identifying and Mapping Assets

What is an asset?

Anything that can be used to improve the quality of community life. Community assets typically include:

- Physical resources
- Natural resources
- Skills
- Talents
- Capabilities
- Social networks

Asset Groupings

We'll be focusing on identifying assets within three broad area classifications, Nature-based, built and human/cultural assets. *Nature-based assets* are those which are important to supporting new and existing nature-based recreational experiences and contributing the quality of life. *Built assets* represent tangible capital investments that provide, or may provide, important functions which contribute to the quality of life. *Human/cultural assets* include the human dimension which represents the "competencies" and "capabilities" of the community and the cultural dimension which includes resources with both economic and cultural values that contribute to tourism, heritage, and to social and cultural enhancement in the community.
