- As of 2022 the region's population increased by 2.6% since 2017, growing by 1,111. Population is expected to increase by 3.2% between 2022 and 2027, adding 1,433.
- From 2017 to 2022, jobs increased by 3.4% in Douglas County, WI from 17,116 to 17,700. As the number of jobs increased, the labor force participation rate decreased from 66.8% to 62.4% between 2017 and 2022.
- Concerning educational attainment, **18.6% of Douglas County, WI residents possess a Bachelor's Degree** (2.2% below the national average), and **13.5% hold an Associate's Degree** (4.7% above the national average).
- The top three industries in 2022 are Education and Hospitals (Local Government), Restaurants and Other Eating Places, and Local Government, Excluding Education and Hospitals.




Jan 2023 Labor Force Breakdown






Unemployment by Gender



Unemployment by Ethnicity








From 2017 to 2022, jobs increased by 3.4% in Douglas County, WI from 17,116 to 17,700.




Douglas County, WI had a January 2023 unemployment rate of 3.84%, decreasing from 3.93% 5 years before.


Millennials

Douglas County, WI has 8,349 millennials (ages 25-39). The national average for an area this size is 9,029.




Veterans

Douglas County, WI has 3,060 veterans. The national average for an area this size is 2,322.




Retiring Soon

Racial diversity is low in Douglas County, WI. The national average for an area this size is 17,988 racially diverse people, while there are 3,984 here.




Property Crime








Top Growing Industries






Top Industry Location Quotient






Top Industry GRP












Top Occupation Earnings








